



Cristo Rey and Good Shepherd Assisted Living Visitor Guidance

Effective April 3, 2023 per L.A. County Public Health Public Health Department regulations.

- Do not visit if you have, or you have been around someone with COVID-like symptoms.
- Visitor Entry screening for visitors is limited to filling out the VISITOR LOG SHEET at cottage front entryways. Thank you for continuing to sign in!
- **Masking: *Updated 4/3/23 by LA County:**
 1. When the community level is LOW: please consider wearing a mask.
 2. When the community level is MEDIUM: wearing a mask is recommended.
 3. When the community level is HIGH: wearing a mask is strongly recommended.

Our community will use the following masking guidance when operating under the different zones (Green, yellow, and red):

Green- All residents free of symptoms

Yellow- One or more residents are in observation for COVID

Red- One or more residents has tested positive for COVID

1. When our community has green or yellow zones: residents, employees, and visitors should consider wearing a mask.
2. When our community has a red zone: residents, employees, and visitors are strongly recommended to wear a mask.
3. All employees, residents, and visitors to a yellow or red zone must wear proper PPE which will be provided by Santa Teresita.

Regardless of Community levels, employees and residents will be encouraged to wear a mask around others if:

- They have respiratory symptoms.
- If you have had significant exposure to someone who has tested positive for COVID19 (wear a mask for 10 days)
- **Indoor Visitations:** Visitors may have meals with the resident they are visiting and may participate in group activities with the resident they are visiting, as long as the visitor-resident groups maintain physical distance from other visitor-resident groups in the facility.
- **Visitors joining for meals: Please refer to our *Guest Meal Form* for how to reserve a location (either Den or Outdoors).**
- Reminder: 6 ft. distancing, mask wearing, and good hand hygiene are still the best ways to prevent the spread of COVID.
